Study of the Readings

Background on the Gospel

Reading Matthew 14:22-33

Today's Gospel follows the account of Jesus feeding a crowd of more than 5,000 with just five loaves and two fish. For the sake of the crowds, Jesus had postponed his time of solitude. Now, at last, Jesus finds some time for quiet and prayer. He sends his disciples ahead of him by boat, dismisses the crowds, and withdraws to the mountain to pray.

The disciples do not fare well. They struggle to weather the wind and waves, making little progress in their journey. We are reminded of a previous story in Chapter 8 of Matthew's Gospel, when Jesus

calms the seas. This time Jesus grants this request. Peter's fear and does not calm the seas, and the doubt overtake him once he is walking on the water. Jesus reaches them see Jesus walking toward them out to Peter and saves him. When on the water. It is not the storm that is feared but the sight of Jesus before them, whom they mistake for God.

Clues like these suggest that this story is about the disciples' growing understanding of the identity of Jesus. It is about what the disciples' faith in Jesus will enable them to do and tells us much about ministry. Jesus calls to the disciples and calms their fears. The impulsive Peter seeks proof that the person is indeed Jesus. He asks Jesus to call him out onto the water, and Jesus

Faith in Jesus will enable the disciples to do the work that Jesus has done. The disciples can and will participate in the work of the kingdom of heaven. When Peter fears and doubts the person of Jesus, however, he falters. Peter's example teaches us that true Christian ministry emerges from the faith that Jesus is the Messiah.

The feast The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary is August 15th, which celebrates Mary's Assumption into heaven. It is one of three feasts of Mary that are **Holy Days of Obligation** for Catholics in the United States. January 1 is the feast of Mary, the Mother of God, and December 8 is the feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary. The assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into heaven has long been held as an important Catholic belief. The belief was not defined as dogma, however, until 1950 by Pope Pius XII. The dogma teaches that Mary, who was without sin, was taken, body and soul, into the glory of heaven. **Mass will be celebrated at 5:30 pm on August 15th.**

Antecedentes de la lectura del Evangelio

Mateo 14:22-33

El Evangelio de hoy sigue el relato de Jesús alimentando a una multitud de más de 5.000 con sólo cinco panes y dos peces. Por el bien de las multitudes, Jesús había pospuesto su tiempo de soledad. Ahora, por fin, Jesús encuentra algo de tiempo para la tranquilidad y la oración. Envía a sus discípulos delante de él en bote, despide a las multitudes y se retira a la montaña para orar.

A los discípulos no les va bien. Luchan por capear el viento y las olas, haciendo poco progreso en su viaje. Se nos recuerda una historia anterior en el capítulo 8 del Evangelio de

Mateo, cuando Jesús calma los mares. Esta vez Jesús no calma los mares, y los discípulos no expresan temor hasta que ven a Jesús caminando hacia ellos en el agua. No es la tormenta lo que se teme, sino la visión de Jesús ante ellos, a quien confunden con un fantasma. Hijo de Dios.

Pistas como estas sugieren que esta historia es sobre la creciente comprensión de los discípulos de la identidad de Jesús. Se trata de lo que la fe de los discípulos en Jesús les permitirá hacer y nos dice mucho sobre el ministerio.
